What is a “Code of Conduct” ?



Definition of a “Code of Conduct”

“A code of conduct is a codification, outlining behaviors, norms, rules, responsibilities or proper practices that can or should be applied in order to reach and respect morally relevant values. As such, moral relevance means the totality of the normative rules, customs and practices of an organisation, group and/or society an individual belongs to.”

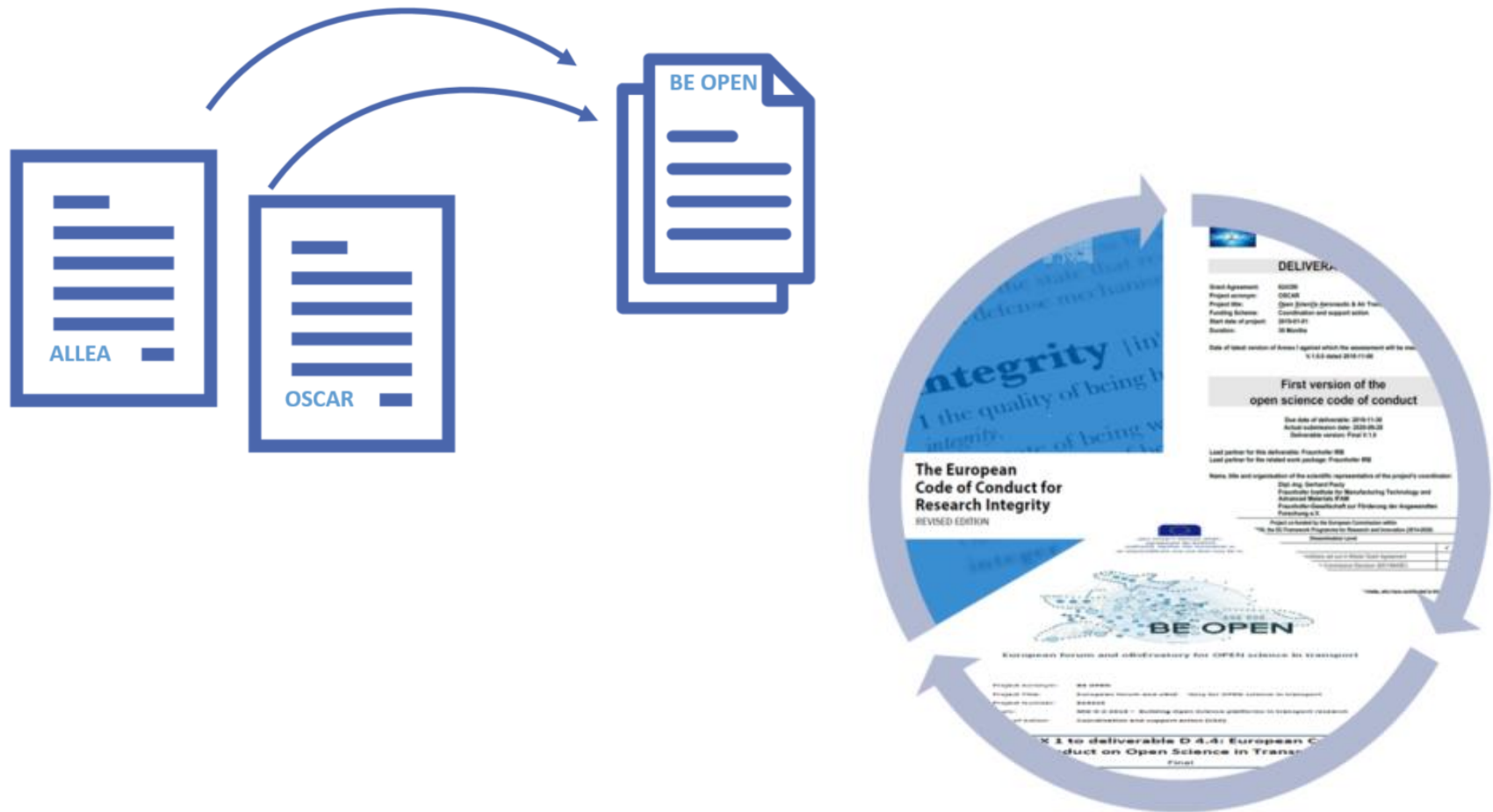

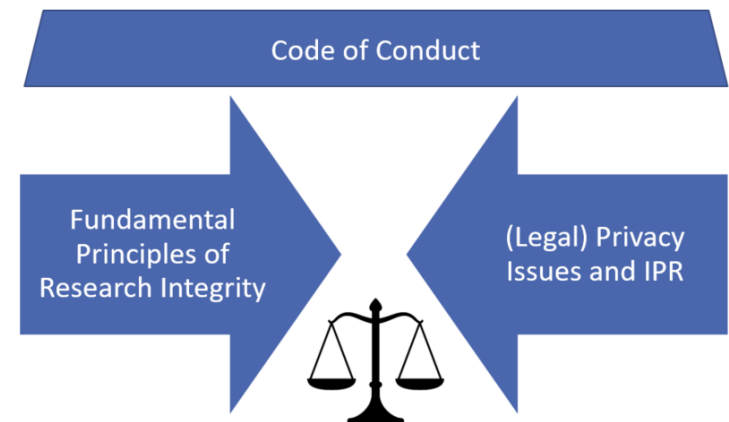

Content of the Code of Conduct

Interaction between Fundamental Research Principles and Legal Principles (Art 16)

- Stakeholders are guided to avoid and prevent any Conflict between both aspects.
- Stakeholders shall appropriately balance any Inevitable Conflicts in such a way that all Principles can develop as far as possible.



Content - Miscellaneous

Stakeholders

- Researchers and Students,
- Research Institutions,
- Organisations and Universities,
- Policy makers (on regional, national and international Level),
- Transport Networks,
- NGOs and Community Organisations,
- Commercial Transport and Logistics Industry Players, and
- Citizens.

Living Document

- The Code of Conduct is a living document.
- It shall be regularly reviewed and updated accordingly.
- It will be updated every 3 – 5 years.
- An Expert Working Group will be formed by the BE OPEN Steering Committee members.

Sanctions

- The Code of Conduct contains **no Sanctions**.
- Organisations may impose their own Sanctions for breaches of the Code of Conduct.



How to adhere to the Code of Conduct

Incorporate Code of Conduct with a simple reference, e.g.:

“We hereby declare that we commit ourselves to the ‘European Code of Conduct on Open Science in Transport’ and its underlying principles”.
